WEBELOS TRANSITION – CHECKLIST FOR SUCCESS

BASIC PRINCIPLES & REQUIREMENTS TRANSITION – is a two-year program

SUCCESS – is measured by how many Fifth Grade Webelos join a Boy Scout Troop and are still members one year later – requires planning an outdoor skills oriented FUN program and "working your plan."
WEBELOS LEADERSHIP POSITIONS – are filled with leaders who:
Have a positive attitude in general, especially toward the Scouting program.
Are trained for their position and committed to their Webelos until transitioned into Boy Scouts.
Communicate early with the Webelos and their parents about differences in Boy Scout program.
Den Leaders have no other leadership position and, ideally, have an Assistant Den Leader.
If more than one Webelos Den in a Pack, select one Den Leader to be the Pack Webelos Den Coordinator.
MARCH – WEBELOS LEADERS PREPARATION: PRIOR TO BEGINNING OF FIFTH GRADE WEBELOS PROGRAM:
Have and review the Webelos Leader Guide (No. 33853A) and <i>Cub Scout Program Helps</i> . See " <i>Reading List for Webelos Scout Leaders</i> "
Understand basics of the Boy Scout program and differences from Cub Scout program.
Attend a Scout Troop meeting and/or Committee meeting.
Read through the SCOUTMASTERS HANDBOOK. PP 11-22; The Boy Led Troop, The Boy Led Patrol.
APRIL – OUTLINE BASIC PROGRAM: REF: 5 TH GRADE WEBELOS SECOND YEAR SCHEDULE
Hold a meeting to inform Webelos parents of the <i>SECOND YEAR SCHEDULE</i> and recruit a "team" of parent leaders. Make the work lighter and more for all leaders. Provide a possitive first impression for the parents.
Inform parents of what the Boy Scout program has to offer their son, differences between the Cub and Boy Scout programs. Ref: "WELCOME TO THE ADVENTURES OF BOY SCOUTING" pamphlet.
Attend Webelos Woods
Plan: <u>FUN</u> Webelos Den activities for spring and summer, in addition to or in place of Pack activities, including who will help with each activity (Ref: Second Year Schedule).
Schedule Den(s) to attend Webelos Adventure Days and/or Navajo Webelos Camp together. (Ref: Cub Camping Planning Packet for dates, fees, and detail information).
<u>DEN LEADERS</u> – attend one or both of the following outdoor training sessions:
Outdoor Webelos Leader (OWL); on how to take Webelos Scouts outdoors to earn activity pins, go hiking and plan great campfire programs and overnight campouts. This will help Webelos Leaders complete basic training requirements. Information will be provided on Arrow of Light ceremonies and the Webelos-to-Scout Transition process.
Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (basic camp skills required in Boy Scouts). (Note: May take Part 2 without taking Part 1 first)

Den Chiefs (a) Have a positive attitude towards Webelos (b) Understand the need for Webelos as necessary "new life" for the Troop. (c) Agree to take Den Leader Training and fulfill DL responsibilities for one year. 	
Consider the possibility of Webelos and Scout Troop meeting at the same time and location with Webelos participating in opening and closing ceremonies.	
Set date for September Parent's Meeting; invite Scoutmaster and Troop Webelos Coordinator.
